“Tips for Talking and What to Say to Prevent Drug and Alcohol Abuse”

Conversations are one of the most powerful tools parents can use to connect with and protect their kids. But when tackling some of life’s tougher topics, especially those about drugs and alcohol, just figuring out what to say can be a challenge. In addition to talking with your child about the dangers of street drugs and alcohol, it’s essential that you also address the abuse of prescription (Rx) drugs and over-the-counter (OTC) cough medicine. This panel discussion will help you navigate how to discuss drug and alcohol abuse with children of all ages.
