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# **TCRHCC Celebrates** Better Hearing & Speech Month



May is Better Hearing and Speech Month, a time to raise awareness about communication disorders and available treatment options that can improve the quality of life for those who experience problems speaking, understanding, or hearing.

ay is Better Hearing and Speech Month (BHSM) and the Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation (TCRHCC) would like to present information about their Audiology and Speech Therapy departments. TCRHCC offers speech and language services in its Physical Rehabilitation Center (PRC), which is located in the Southeast corner of the TCRHCC campus. TCRHCC employs two full-time speech-language pathologists, Valerie Yazzie, MA, CCC-SLP and Cheryl Saganitso, MA, CCC-SLP.

Valerie is currently the PRC's speech therapy/ occupational therapy manager. She has been a speechlanguage pathologist for 18 years, with experience in both hospital and school settings. She has been employed with TCRHCC for 11 years. She received her Bachelor of Science degree in Speech and Hearing Sciences with a minor in Psychology from the University of Arizona in Tucson, AZ and her Master of Science degree in Clinical Speech-Language Pathology from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, AZ.

Cheryl has been a speech-language pathologist for

14 years, with primary experience in school settings. She has been employed with TCRHCC for 8 months. She received her Bachelor of Science degree from Arizona State University in Speech and Hearing Sciences in Tempe, AZ and received her Master of Arts degree from the University of Kansas in Lawrence, KS in Clinical Speech-Language Pathology.

Both speech-language pathologists are full Navajo and graduated from Tuba City High School.



### What is a speech-language pathologist?

They don't only 'help people speak better'. A speech-language pathologist (SLPs) works to prevent, assess, diagnose, and treat speech, language, social communication, cognitivecommunication, and swallowing disorders in children and adults. Speech-language pathologists who work in healthcare settings are certified by the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA). "ASHA-certified SLPs are the only health care professionals specifically educated and prepared to evaluate and treat children and adults with speech, language, and swallowing problems. ASHA-certified SLPs are the only health care professionals who possess either a master's or doctoral degree from an accredited program, complete a postgraduate clinical fellowship, and pass a national examination to receive their professional credential: the Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology (CCC-SLP) from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association." (www.asha.org).

Speech is a person's ability to say sounds and words, which includes making speech sounds with the mouth, lips and tongue (articulation), how the voice is used (voice), and the rhythm of speech (fluency).

Language is a person's ability to use words and manipulate those words to communicate. These include word meanings (semantics), manipulating words to change their meanings (semantics), putting words in order correctly (syntax), and determining how to say words in different settings (pragmatics). Delays or difficulties in any of these areas, or combination of areas, can result in speech and/or language disorders. With a referral obtained from a physician, a speech-language pathologist evaluates a patient, determines diagnosis, and treats the identified disorder (speech, language, cognitive-communication, voice, and swallowing disorders), if there is one.

### TCRHCC Speech Therapy Outpatient & Inpatient Clinic Services

TCRHCC Speech-Language Pathologists are committed to assisting individuals achieve optimal communication and swallowing function. A physician referral is required for all patients. Once you have a referral for a speech evaluation or therapy from your primary care doctor, we



will schedule an appointment for you or your child's evaluation with our speech-language pathologists.

### **TCRHCC Speech-Language Services**

- Adult speech
- Pediatric speech
- Communication
- Voice
- Adults: Swallowing/feeding therapies primarily due to stroke, head injury, central nervous system diseases, and respiratory diseases.
- **Pediatrics**: Swallowing/feeding therapies primarily due to language, articulation/phonology, cognitive-communication, swallow/feeding, and fluency disorders.

If you have any concerns, please see your primary care doctor to make a referral to our clinic.

### **TCRHCC Audiology**

TCRHCC's audiology department is located in the Main Hospital on the main level, across from the dental clinic. The audiology department has a staff of two doctors of audiology, one audiology health technician, and one medical support assistant. Doctors of audiology include Dr. Sherry Miller, and Dr. Susan Zimmerman.

Dr. Miller is currently the Director of Audiology.

She has been a practicing audiologist for 22 years, with experience in hospital and private practice settings. She has been employed with TCRHCC for over 7 years. Dr. Miller received her Doctor of Audiology degree from The School of Audiology at Pennsylvania College of Optometry (now Salus University).

Dr. Zimmerman has been practicing audiology for over 20 years. She also has experience in clinical, industry, and retail environments, and has been employed with TCRHCC for 4 months. [Completed graduate work at University of Wisconsin, and received her Doctoral degree from A.T. Stills University in Phoenix, AZ]

### What is an audiologist?

An audiologist is a hearing health care specialist who is trained, certified, and licensed to evaluate hearing and balance problems, make appropriate medical referrals & follow-up recommendations, and prescribe and fit hearing systems. Today, a Doctor of Audiology (Au.D) degree is required to become a clinical audiologist. Audiologists are licensed in all 50 states.

There are approximately 15,000 practicing audiologists in the United States. Audiologists work in a variety of different practice settings including private practice clinics, hospitals, military clinics, schools, universities and industrial settings.

### What exactly does an audiologist do?

Audiologists are trained and licensed to manage many areas of audiologic health care, including providing the following services:

- Comprehensive audiologic evaluations of hearing sensitivity, speech understanding, middle ear function, inner ear & auditory nerve function for adult & pediatric populations
- Diagnostic assessments to identify balance/ dizziness disorders
- Design, selection, & fitting of hearing instruments & assistive listening devices
- Rehabilitation therapy for hearing disorders
- Evaluation & management of tinnitus (ringing in the ears)
- Patients and family counseling related to diagnosis and treatment
- Development and implementation of hearing conservation programs to prevent hearing loss
- Increasing awareness about and prevention of the ingestion of ototoxic substances
- Research and development of new evaluation techniques and rehabilitation strategies



We have a well-equipped audiology clinic with state-of-the-art technology, including: large sound proof booth, audiometer, tympanometry, otoacoustic emissions system, and hearing aid programming & verification computer systems. We participate in many continuing education events every year and remain current with diagnostic methodology and the latest technological advances in the hearing systems supplied to us by major, international manufacturers. All of this and more assist us in accomplishing our mission to help patients of all ages on a path to better hearing and improved communication abilities.

Referral from a healthcare provider is required for evaluation.

Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation will be offering our annual TCRHCC Nursing Scholarship. Funding will be awarded to 4 Native American Nursing Students. Interested applicants will be required to submit the following:

- 2 page Essay to include: What inspires you to pursue nursing as a career? What are your ultimate career goals? How will this scholarship help you to improve care for the Native American community?
- Resume, include membership to service organizations and/or involvement in community service activities.
- Certificate of enrollment in a Federally recognized Indian Tribe
- Official written confirmation of acceptance & enrollment in a 2 year A.D.N. or B.S.N. program of an accredited nursing school program.

- Official school transcripts
- 2 letters of recommendation from 2 people not related to the applicant. The person is to be familiar with the applicant's work history and/or academic performance. One of the letters must be from an employer/ supervisor, or school faculty member.

# The deadline date for all applications is July 28, 2018.

The selection process is competitive and not guaranteed. Prior scholarship recipients will receive priority. Chosen applicants must commit to a term of 1 year obligated service as an employed nurse with TCRHCC per awarded scholarship received.

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# **TCRHCC Nurses Become** Certified Sexual-Assault Examiners

# A Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) is a registered nurse who has been specially trained to provide comprehensive care to sexual assault survivors in a medical setting.

On February 8, 2018, the Tuba City Regional Health Care Corporation (TCRHCC) Domestic Violence Prevention Initiative program coordinated a training in Tuba City to certify 9 nurses to become a certified Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE).

Nurses that become certified SANEs do it in addition to their regular job duties. They take on this extra role because they want to help survivors.

The SANE Training is provided by the International Association Of Forensic Nurses (IAFN), an international membership organization comprised of forensic nurses working around the world and other professionals who support and complement the work of forensic nursing.

The program is designed for nurses interested in providing forensic medical assessment and care to survivors of sexual assault. The 40-hour course is designed to provide registered nurses with a comprehensive education program consisting of:

- Assessment
- Examination
- Collection of forensic evidence
- Evaluation of sexual assault victims
- Testifying in court

SANEs are highly valued at TCRHCC. When a patient reports an assault, the SANE nurses take over their care from beginning to end. They do clinical assessments, carefully document injuries and painstakingly collect, package and store evidence to ensure it can be useful to law enforcement. They also work closely with the TCRHCC SART/DVPI Program Coordinator to ensure patients have needed support during these exams - and a connection to support after they are discharged from the hospital.

The SANEs work is not done when the patient leaves, though. If the case goes to trial, the SANE is called to testify, where he/she will be asked to discuss the exam findings and to educate the judge and jury about exam findings in sexual assault and psychological responses to sexual assault.

Today, TCRHCC SANE program has 13 Adult SANE nurses and 2 Pediatric SANE nurses.

"These nurses are amazing and keep me motivated every day. They are going out of their way to help survivors heal," said the TCRHCC SART/DVPI Program Coordinator, Sara Thompson, who organizes the SANE trainings for TCRHCC.

# How To Help

### How to Help Someone You Care About Tips from RAINN

It's not always easy to know what to say when someone tells you they've been sexually assaulted, especially when that person is a family member, friend, or loved one. Consider the following ways of showing support:

- Listen. Communicate without judgement.
- **Be there.** If the survivor seeks medical attention or plans to report, offer to be there. Your presence can offer the support they need.
- Offer support. Encourage the survivor to get support. Share resources like the National Sexual Assault Hotline and online.rainn.org, but realize that only they can make the decision to get help.
- **Be Patient**. Remember, there is no timetable for recovering from trauma. Avoid putting pressure on them to engage in activities they aren't ready to do yet.
- Encourage self-care. Following an assault it is important to practice good self-care during this difficult time.
