Training/workshop summary -

1. Who am I? An Intercultural Competency Workshop

What are my beliefs? How are my actions shaped? How do I engage with others in communities? How does what I believe impact how I work with others? This workshop serves as an introduction to the cultural forces at play in creating and maintaining the systems around us. In the workshop, we examine the role of Narratives, Social Location, and Values in creating our understandings of how the world works. We also examine how our understandings can be a crucial first step towards either justice or can lead to a sabotage of our efforts to build stronger communities. This is a great place to start for leaders, staff, caseworkers, boards, and collectives who are interested in sustainable, community-based, and transformative strategies for building community.

2. Poverty and the Illusion of Choice

How do we solve poverty? What are the root causes of poverty? Whose responsibility is it to solve poverty? Do people have a choice to be poor or move out of poverty? What does that choice look like? This workshop actively engages the systemic root causes of poverty. These systemic roots continue to push families into poverty and perpetuate the cycle of poverty. Ultimately, these systemic roots undermine our efforts to end poverty. Participants will learn about the role of housing, education, and economic systems maintain poverty.

3. Navigator Training offered by Arizona Coalition for Military Families
Resource Navigators are members of our community who are trained to connect service
members, veterans & their family members to the right resources at the right time.

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
