What is a Mobile Service Day?

Remote Service Days bring county services to local communities. Staff from each office will be available to meet with citizens, provide general services and answer questions

What is a widow/widower Exemption?

A Widow or Widower who resided in Arizona at the time of their spouse's death and who is also on a limited income may apply for a reduction in the valuation that is used to calculate an individual's property tax.

What is the Disabled Persons Exemption?

An individual over the age of 17, who has been certified as 100% disabled and who is also on a limited income may apply for a reduction in the valuation that is used to calculate an individual's property tax.

What are the income limitations for the Widow/Widower and Disability exemption programs? For 2018, the income limitation is \$32,447 for an individual or \$38,926 for more than a one member household. Some sources of income such as VA benefits and Federal Social Security may be <u>excluded</u> from the exemption program income limitation.

How do I apply for the exemption programs?

Bring copies of income (for all household members) to a remote service day location or the downtown Flagstaff office location and an Assessor staff will help review the requirements and assist in the application process. The deadline for exemption program application is April 1, 2018.

When are taxes due and how do I pay them?

Annual property tax notices are issued on a calendar year basis. Taxpayers have the option to pay their annual taxes in two equal installments. The first installment is due by November 1, 2017 and the second installment is due by May 1, 2018. Taxpayers can also pay in full by December 31, 2017. Tax bills of \$100 or less have to be paid in full by December 31, 2017. Taxpayers can pay their taxes in person, by mail, or online.
